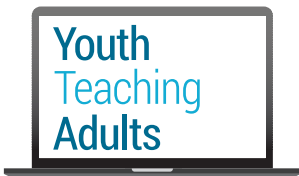

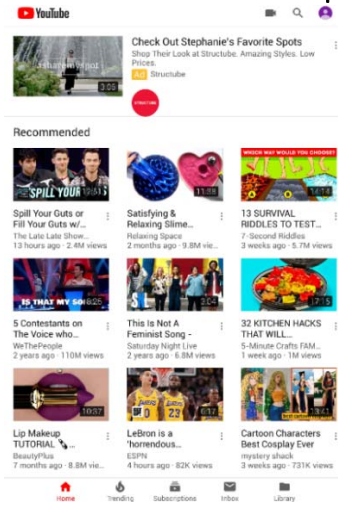
Find the YouTube app



- Ask your student to find the YouTube app. They can look for it on the home screen.
- Ask your student to tap on the YouTube app to open it

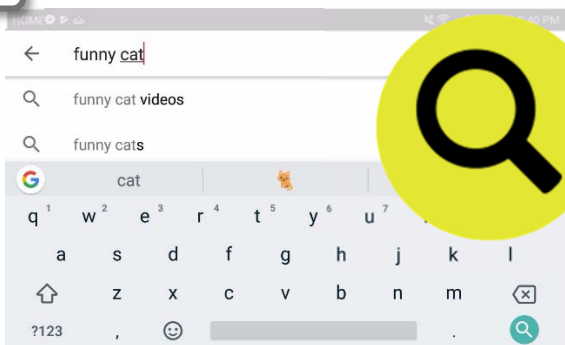
View the YouTube homepage



- Go through the different sections of the YouTube homepage with your student. Tell them about the section showing “trending” videos.
- Explain to your student that many people and organizations put videos on YouTube. Some people share videos of their cats doing funny things. Some news channels share news stories.

Search for a video



- Ask your student to tap on the **search** bar
- Ask your student to type **funny cat videos**
- Ask them to tap on the search icon

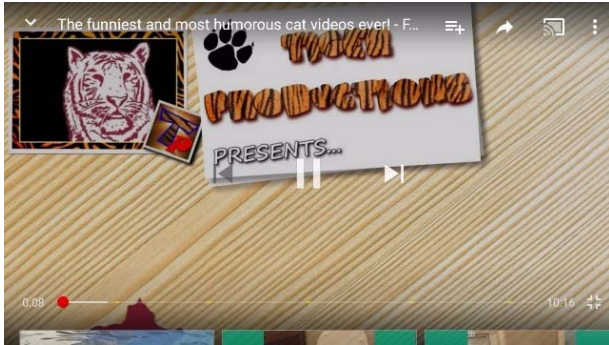
Find a video



- Explain to your student that the images on the left are previews of what they will see in the video. Show them the video title and how many times the video has been watched.
- Ask your student to scroll through the list of videos. Tell them to tap on the one with the most views.

5

Watch a video



- Ask your student to watch the video for a couple of seconds
- Show your student how to:
 - ↳ pause the video
 - ↳ play the video after pausing
 - ↳ skip ahead in the video

6

Practice



- Ask your student to go to the search bar again
- Ask them what they want to search for. Ask them to search for it. For example, they could search for a recipe.
- Ask your student to watch the video for a couple of seconds. Then ask them to pause it, play it and skip ahead.
