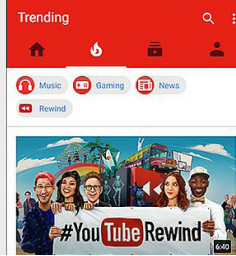

Find the YouTube app

- Find the YouTube app. You can look for it on your device's home screen or in the app launcher. The app launcher shows you all the apps you have on your device.
- Tap on the **YouTube** app to open it
- If YouTube isn't installed on your device, open the Play Store. You can search for **YouTube** and download the app. If you've never downloaded apps before, do [this lesson](#) first.

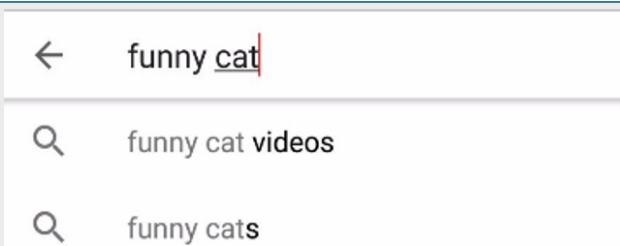

View the YouTube homepage

- There are all kinds of videos on YouTube. Some people share videos of their cats doing funny things. Some news channels share news stories.
- The homepage suggests videos that Youtube thinks you'll like, based on other videos you've watched
- The section that says "Trending" shows you what videos are popular right now

Search for a video

- Tap on the **search** bar
- Type **funny cat videos**, then tap on the search icon

Find a video

- The images on the left are previews of what you'll see in the video. The video's title is next to the preview image.
- Scroll through the list of videos. Tap on the one with the most views.
- **Note:** All kinds of people and organizations add videos to YouTube. You might find videos on YouTube that make you uncomfortable or that have information that's not true.
